

Eden Township Board of Supervisors
Minutes of the February 13, 2019 Meeting
(rescheduled from February 11, 2019 due to inclement weather)

Call-to-Order: Supervisor David Rineer called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

Attendance: Supervisors David Rineer, Randy Kylar and Joseph Rineer; Mark Rudy, Gerry Parker and Szilvia Troutman. Also the following members of the public: Melvin Stoltzfus, Amos Ebersol, Elam E. Beiler, Joseph B. Beiler, Jacob E. Beiler and Ephraim L. Zook.

Public Participation: None.

Supervisors Meeting Minutes: The minutes of the January 14, 2019 Supervisors meeting were reviewed. David Rineer motioned, Joseph Rineer seconded to approve the minutes; motion carried unanimously.

Treasurer's Report: The Treasurer's report for January 2019, in the amount of \$378,620.70 (attached), was approved on a motion by David Rineer and seconded by Joseph Rineer; motion carried unanimously.

Payment of Bills: The list of bills to be paid in February 2019, in the amount of \$39,903.29 (attached), was approved on a motion by David Rineer and seconded by Joseph Rineer; motion carried unanimously.

SEO Report: The SEO report listed activity of \$300.00 for the month of January 2019.

Tax Collector's Report: No report.

Zoning Officer's Report: The Zoning Officer's report listed activity in the amount of \$7,948.00 for the month of January 2019.

Road Master's Report: The Road Master's report of activity in January 2019 was reviewed. Mark met with Mark Wilson and showed him Eden Twp's section of the Rail Trail. The waterway will initially be cleaned using grant funds and a permit will be acquired to allow for ongoing cleaning. Quarryville Borough is looking at adding two trailheads downtown (N. Church or N. Hess). Providence Twp may be adding a new trailhead as well (at a new proposed development).

Solanco Public Safety Committee: No report.

Emergency Management: No report.

Southern Lancaster County Inter-Municipal Council: The emergency management crisis was discussed – there is not enough funding or volunteers.

Correspondence: Received correspondence was reviewed and disseminated.

Old Business:

Hess Rd Stormwater Issue (Elam Beiler Property): Mr. Beiler requested more time to get the project done since the ground is too wet. The Supervisors explained that the swale must be installed before crops are planted.

Ephraim Zook – Unpaid Invoice for Road Damage (Stony Hill Rd): A civil complaint was filed against Mr. Zook with the district justice.

Bowery Run Stream Restoration Project: To coordinate with the Township's bridge replacement project, a meeting will be scheduled on site with US Fish & Wildlife, LCCD and the Township.

Dirt & Gravel Rd Grant Application/Cherry Hill Rd: The Township will not need to reapply for additional funding. Instead, LCCD will add to the existing grant to allow for building up Cherry Hill Rd. Bart Township was requested to fix their end.

JD Loader: The Township was not the highest bidder.

Equipment Co-Ops: A meeting will be held on March 12th between the member townships.

New Business:

Act 537 – Regional Plan Option: DEP and LCPC recommend that municipalities in the Southern End (Fulton, Little Britain, East Drumore and Eden Twps) develop a regional Act 537 plan. The Board was open to discussing the idea further but wanted to know how much a regional approach would cut down on the cost.

Resolution #2019-02-13-01 Adoption of Lancaster Co. Hazard Mitigation Plan: On a motion by David Rineer and seconded by Joseph Rineer, the Supervisors adopted the Lancaster Co. Hazard Mitigation Plan under **Resolution #2019-02-13-01**. Motion passed unanimously.

Skids in Waterway off old Pumping Station Rd Driveway: The skids have been removed and PennDot was notified. The skids blocked the waterway and diverted water onto Pumping Station Rd.

Two-Way Radios: Different options were looked at to buy radios – it was decided to buy them from the County. Joe Rineer will find out if they could be purchased through the Quarryville Fire Company to reduce cost (ca. \$1,800 per radio).

Public Participation:

Ephraim Zook (399 Stony Hill Rd) asked why he had to pay for the damage he caused with his manure spreader on Stony Hill Rd. Jacob Beiler questioned the date when the photographs were taken of the damage. The Supervisors explained that Mr. Zook was responsible and had to pay the \$1,600 bill for fixing the road, or he could request a hearing with the district justice.

Adjournment: A motion to adjourn the meeting was made by David Rineer and seconded by Joseph Rineer; motion carried unanimously.

The meeting adjourned at 8:34 PM.
